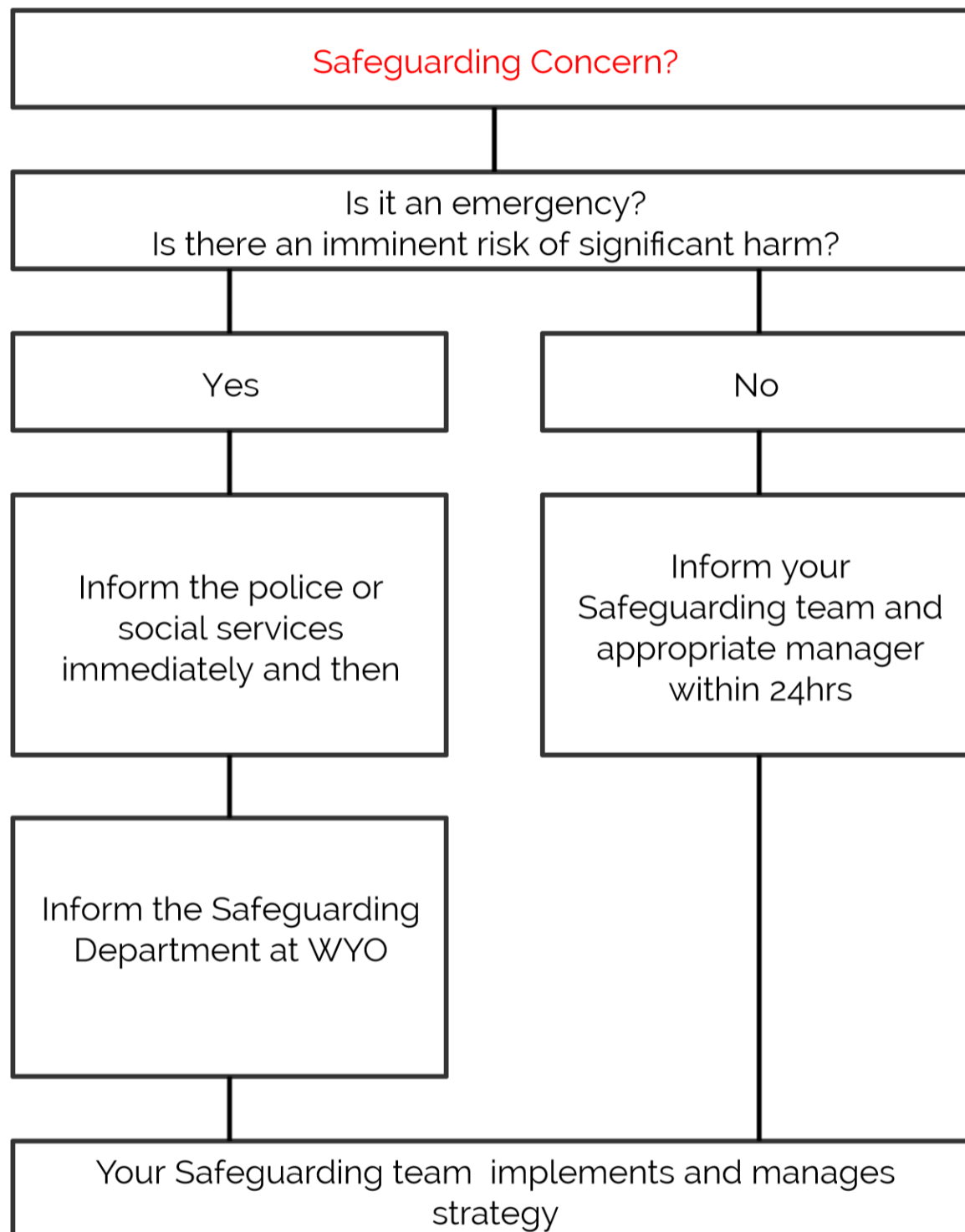

If there is an imminent risk of significant harm, contact the police or your local social services immediately. Do not leave that person until you can hand them over to the appropriate responsible person. Say that you are making a referral and need to speak to the appropriate person.  
**When making such a contact you should:**

- say who you are
- give the details of the person at risk
- state what they have told you
- provide any relevant background information
- ask what will happen next.

Then contact your Safeguarding Department after you have spoken to the authorities. Do not delay in contacting your Safeguarding Department, whatever the time, and always make sure that you keep them aware of any further developments. Do not discuss the situation with anyone who does not need to know. Continue to be caring and supportive for the child or vulnerable adult.

**In a non-emergency situation, inform your Safeguarding Department and then the appropriate manager or superior within 24 hours.**
